Monetary Assistance Available for Community Non-Profits

The City of Artesia recognizes the value that non-profit organizations have in providing services that benefit the community. The City has implemented a Community Benefits Grant Program to provide monetary assistance to eligible community non-profit organizations to support their efforts to provide social, educational, and cultural services to Artesia residents. The City still has some funds available to award this fiscal year, FY 2021-2022. In order to be eligible, interested organizations must complete an application and fulfill specific eligibility criteria. All applications are reviewed to determine which projects best meet the social service and cultural program needs of the City. Applications will be evaluated for consideration on a first-come, first-served basis. Visit www.cityofartesia.us for more information.

Artesia Small Business Grant Program



The City of Artesia offers a Small Business Grant Program for small businesses in the City who have been negatively impacted by COVID-19. Artesia's Small Business Grant Program provides businesses with assistance in job creation and retention. The grant provides \$10,000 for businesses with up to 15 total employees (not including the owner). The City has availability for 7 more applicants (as of 2/25/22), and will accept applications on a first-come, first-served basis. Those interested are encouraged to apply immediately.

Who Is Eligible?

In order to be eligible for funding, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- The business must be in Artesia and must have been in operation as of March 1, 2020
- The program is limited to qualifying business owners that are for-profit businesses ordered to close by either the state or local government or had to lay off at least one full-time or part-time employee due to circumstances created by COVID-19
- Proof of loss of income (comparison year is fiscal year 2018/2019, or calendar year 2019 based on the business practices)
- Must have a valid business license in Artesia at the time of applying
- Business must not have active code violations
- Business must provide proof of a valid Certificate of Occupancy
- Business must have a commercial storefront (no home base businesses can apply)
- Business must be up-to-date on paying Measure V taxes prior to being awarded
- Business must be able to provide a copy of the property lease or show proof of property ownership

Interested businesses must submit an application and provide a valid business license and proof of a Valid Certificate of Occupancy at the time of applying. Only one application will be accepted per applicant, regardless if the owner has multiple business interests within the City.

Participating businesses will be monitored over the course of a year to ensure retention was maintained, as a result of receiving the grant. Businesses will be required to provide receipts to show how the grant funds were used. For more information, call City Hall at (562) 865-6262.

City offers Residents Academy Program



The City of Artesia offers a free Academy Program that includes quarterly presentations that provide residents information about the functions of their City, services that are available, and opportunities to get involved. The first Academy presentation was held late last year. The next presentation is scheduled from 6 to 7 p.m. on Wednesday, April 6th at the Albert O. Little Community Center, located at 18750 Clarkdale Avenue. The presentation will cover Planning and Housing and will last between 1 to 1 ½ hours. It will provide an overview of the City's planning process, home improvements, and services offered by the City's Community Development Department.

The Residents Academy will feature two more presentations to be held quarterly. The topics will include Community Preservation and Maintenance and Sustainability. A resident can register to attend just one presentation for the topic of their choice, or all the upcoming presentations. Scheduled dates for upcoming presentations will be provided to those that register for the rest of the series, as the time frame for each presentation nears.



The City of Artesia has developed and adopted an Active Transportation Plan (ATP) to meet the City’s goals for providing a transportation system that supports walking, cycling, public transit, and automobiles. The ATP was developed through a public engagement process that included a series of pop-up tables at City events, virtual community listening sessions, and online surveys, to obtain feedback from residents and visitors.

The adopted Plan includes ideas for potential improvements along streets that will make walking and bicycling easier, safer, and more convenient. The ideas for the projects in the plan, came directly from the input of community members.



On the list of priority projects are Pioneer Boulevard, Gridley Road, and improvements along 183rd Street. Community input that influenced these projects include access to parks, schools, retail centers, and public transit, such as the future West Santa Ana Branch light rail line. Creating an Active Transportation Plan to make the community more walkable, can help transform and revitalize neighborhoods in Artesia by making it easier to get around the City. Organics Recycling: New Changes Coming for Residents and Businesses

Effective January 1, 2022, the City of Artesia is required to comply with SB 1383. The intent of this bill is to reduce short-lived climate pollutants that contribute to greenhouse gas emissions, and air pollution resulting from decomposing organic waste (specifically food scrap waste). The three main goals of SB 1383 are:

- 1) Reducing organic waste disposal by 50 percent of the 2014 level by 2020.
- 2) Reducing organic waste disposal by 75 percent of 2014 levels by 2025, which would be more than 20-million tons.
- 3) Recovering 20 percent of currently disposed of edible food for human consumption through food banks, and related human services organizations by 2025.

Through this new law, the City is required to enforce business and residential organic and food waste recycling and comply with other requirements of the regulation. The City is responsible for funding, administering, and implementing the goals of SB 1383. In order to meet these requirements, the City has already completed or is working towards completing action items to be compliant. One of those requirements is revising the City's existing organic collection services. SB 1383 prohibits organics and food waste from landfill disposal, and requires it to be converted into compost or other recyclable material. The City is working with CR&R, Incorporated (CR&R), the City's contracted hauler, to negotiate a new agreement for source-separated collection and processing services. The City will work with CR&R to negotiate new rates reflecting pass through and program compliance monitoring costs to determine a fair and reasonable adjustment to the maximum rate. The City anticipates full implementation will take place by this summer. Please refer to the current recycling guide below with information on which items to place in the corresponding carts for now.

CURRENT RECYCLING GUIDE (NEW GUIDE COMING THIS SUMMER)



1. The carts should be placed at the curbside no later than 6:30 am on collection day and removed from the curbside within 12 hours after service.
2. The carts should be placed with the handles and wheels facing towards your home.
3. Place carts side-by-side approximately 1 foot apart and at least 3 feet from any obstruction (i.e. vehicles, fire hydrants, trees).
4. Items placed outside of carts will not be collected. Cart lids should be closed. Please do not overload.
