- **Advancing Sustainability Projects:** Completing the Historic District Recreation Trail tree and landscape planting project, supporting the City's environmental goals.

The City's first FlashVote survey took place from February 4-6, and the results are in!

When asked about the overall direction of the City, 45% of respondents felt the City is headed in the right direction, while the remainder were split from not having a strong feeling either way, or feeling the City still had room for improvement.

Participants were asked about our strengths as a city and overwhelmingly responded that our recreational amenities and sense of community were strong points, followed by the availability of businesses and services, along with our public safety presence.

When asked to rank the same choices in order of importance, respondents said that Physical Safety and Security was ranked highest.

Upcoming challenges within the next five years as envisioned by respondents included street maintenance, public safety, homelessness, and housing affordability.

The final question solicited general comments or suggestions about community priorities. Pride of property ownership, road safety, street parking, economic development, and illegal dumping were all raised as opportunities for the City Council to consider as part of the goal setting and budgeting process.



Updates to Temporary Outdoor Lighting Rules

The City Council has approved an amendment to the City's Municipal Code regulating temporary outdoor lighting in residential zones. Previously limited to commercial and industrial areas, the updated rules now apply to holiday and decorative lighting in neighborhoods and take effect on March 11.

The change addresses concerns about temporary lights left too long, resulting in sagging strands, burnt-out bulbs, and glare. The City also found temporary lighting was sometimes used in place of permanent exterior fixtures, creating safety and visibility issues.

The ordinance prohibits aerial lasers, flashing lights, rooftop illumination, and lights aimed at neighbors or streets. All exterior lighting must be shielded, directed downward, prevent light trespass, and be turned off during daylight.

Holiday lights may remain installed 30 days before and after a holiday. For details, contact the Community Development Department at 562-865-6262.

New Fireworks Regulations in Effect

As families and friends gather to celebrate this Independence Day, the City reminds residents that while "safe and sane" fireworks are permitted within city limits, illegal fireworks remain a serious safety hazard.

The Artesia City Council recently adopted updates to the Municipal Code that increase fines and strengthen accountability for violations.

Under the revised ordinance, property owners are responsible for any illegal fireworks discharged on or adjacent to their property—regardless of who sets them off or whether the owner is present. If a property

owner hosts or allows a gathering and a guest uses illegal fireworks, the property owner may be cited and fined.

Fines for violations are as follows:

- First Violation: \$2,000
- Second Violation: \$3,500
- Third and Subsequent Violations: \$5,000

CO-EXISTING WITH COYOTES



Coyote sightings in City neighborhoods have become increasingly common. While the City does not handle or remove coyotes directly, it does keep track of sightings and encounters. Residents can report coyote sightings through the City's online Service Request System by visiting www.cityofartesia.us and selecting "Report a Concern." For further assistance, sightings and incidents can also be reported to the State Department of Fish and Wildlife at apps.wildlife.ca.gov/wir or by phone at (562) 596-3885. Problem coyotes and incidents should be reported to Los Angeles County Animal Care and Control at (562) 940-6898.

Residents are reminded that a few simple actions can help minimize conflicts between residents, pets, and coyotes. If you encounter a coyote, remember to make yourself appear as big as possible and be loud! Stand tall with your arms overhead, hold your ground, and never run. It is crucial not to feed coyotes as this can encourage aggressive behavior. Remove ripe garden vegetables and fallen fruit and store pet food indoors. Ensure that garbage and compost containers are tightly sealed. Take other preventative measures such as adding motion sensing lighting to deter coyotes. By taking a few simple actions and staying vigilant, we can keep pets, property, and ourselves safe. Visit the City's website at the QR code.

Help Meet Organic Waste Requirements

California law requires every city in the state to establish an organic waste recycling program and ensure compliance. Senate Bill 1383 aims to reduce emissions of short-lived climate pollutants. Organic waste mainly includes kitchen food scraps and yard trimmings, such as landscape debris and pruning waste.

Both green yard trimmings and kitchen scraps must be recycled in the green organics cart. Compostable bags are optional and can be purchased from local retailers, but other types of plastic bags are not accepted.

Food scrap pails are available at City Hall to help residents separate food waste. Please visit City Hall to pick one up today! The City's waste hauler, CR&R, helps divert organic waste from landfills by converting it into soil amendments at its composting facility.


